From the Pastor's Desk

How do we help people have a personal experience with the Living God?

This is the question the pastors, including Jerry and me, wrestled with during our most recent pastors' training for our Healthy Church Initiative Program (HCI). Many of us have experienced "God moments". These are the times in our lives when we feel a living encounter between ourselves and the heart of God. These moments might come as a:

- New learning: New, life changing, and prompting information from scripture
- New insight: New, recognition that has to do with faith, God or Jesus sometimes happens in the midst of grappling with a decision, crisis, or a challenge
- New heart belief: New awareness of a belief at an emotional level that changes our choices or behaviors
- New spiritual nudge: A brief moment when we experience an awareness of God's tangible presence and call to action

These are the God created encounters that need to be additionally fueled in order to continue moving us along our path of spiritual maturity. We were reminded that God is ceaselessly looking for opportunities to enter and connect our spirit with the miraculous and transforming activity of the Holy Spirit.

We shared our personal "God moments" with each other, stories of where and how we felt God's presence moving us forward on our journeys of spiritual growth. We all agreed that as leaders of our respective churches it is our responsibility to help our people recognize, share, and continue moving along the path of spiritual maturity. One of the primary ways we can help our congregations along the path of spiritual growth is during our worship services.

Next we evaluated our own worship services, church activities, committee meetings and other occasions to see if we are creating a culture to share, acknowledge, and celebrate these "God moments". Although we are all providing and cultivating "some space" we also have room for improvement. We contemplated the question, "Is God glorified by mediocracy?" We resoundingly decided NO, and made a commitment to "open up more space" for the Spirit to help people have a personal experience with the Living God. Stay tuned on how we "open up more space" here at Hillcrest.

Healthy Church Initiative

Breakthrough Prayer Answered at Hillcrest! "Countdown to Cool-Down"

Every summer, from mid-June until early September, Hillcrest UMC holds their worship in the Fellowship Hall. Where our sanctuary does not have air conditioning, the Fellowship Hall does and enables us to worship comfortably. While we are comfortable, this is not the ideal place to worship and we look forward to returning to the sanctuary to worship.

This summer, we have had the privilege to receive \$40,000 from an estate – which went directly to our Air Conditioner fund! With this money, your Trustee Committee went forward with bidding out and choosing air conditioners for our Sanctuary!

As nothing can be without a few bumps, during this process we discovered that to support the 4 (four) units being installed in the sanctuary, we would have to update some electricity panels. An additional \$13,000 was added to our total bill.

Because God answers our prayers, soon after learning of these added expenses, we received an unexpected undesignated memorial check for \$5,000! Pastor Jill spoke with the family, who readily agreed that this money could be used for our air conditioning (the family member clearly remembers being married in the Hillcrest UMC Sanctuary at the end of August years ago- and how hot it was - she was more than delighted to help in that regard!).

With an estimated total bill of \$53,000 to purchase and install the air conditioning system in the sanctuary, God has blessed us with persons who have covered \$45,000 (that's almost **85%** of the total bill!) right off the bat!

With our air conditioners installed, and electrical updates taking place, we are asking our congregation to help cover the remaining \$8,000 of the total bill. There are offering envelopes available called "Countdown to Cooldown". Use these to help us finish raising that final 15%!


