- What does it mean that God's Spirit is with us all the time?

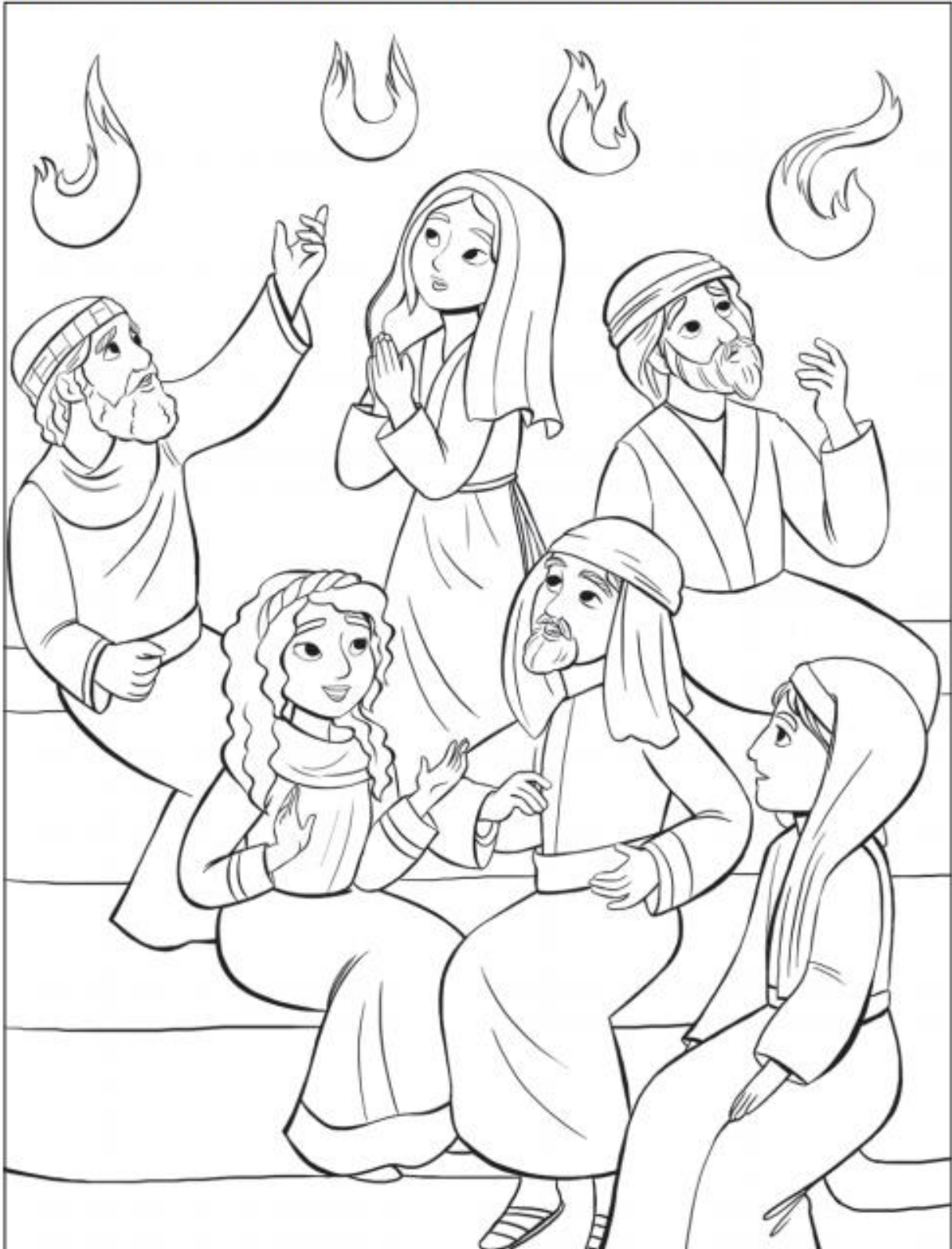
Because God's Spirit is with us, we are free from fear and free to serve others.
